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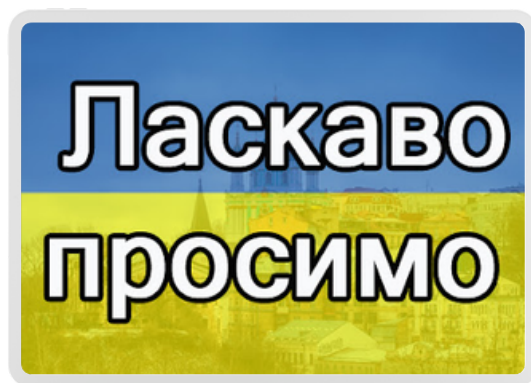

This “ Welcome Handbook for Migrant Students and Guardians” is the result of an inclusion initiative, felt by all the partners to be an urgent need to welcome and include children and young people who arrive in our municipality and begin their schooling here.

This document is intended to be a consultation tool for parents, children and young people, facilitating their knowledge of the Portuguese education system, as well as the functioning of schools group.

Portuguese Educational System

Portugal's education system is regulated by the State through the Ministry of Education and Science and is divided into three levels: basic, secondary and higher education.

Compulsory schooling is 12 years, starting at the age of 6 and only ending when the young person completes the 12th grade or reaches the age of 18.

Pre-school education is the first stage of basic education and is complementary to the family's educational action, with which it must establish close cooperation. It is aimed at children who are 3 years old until they enter compulsory schooling.

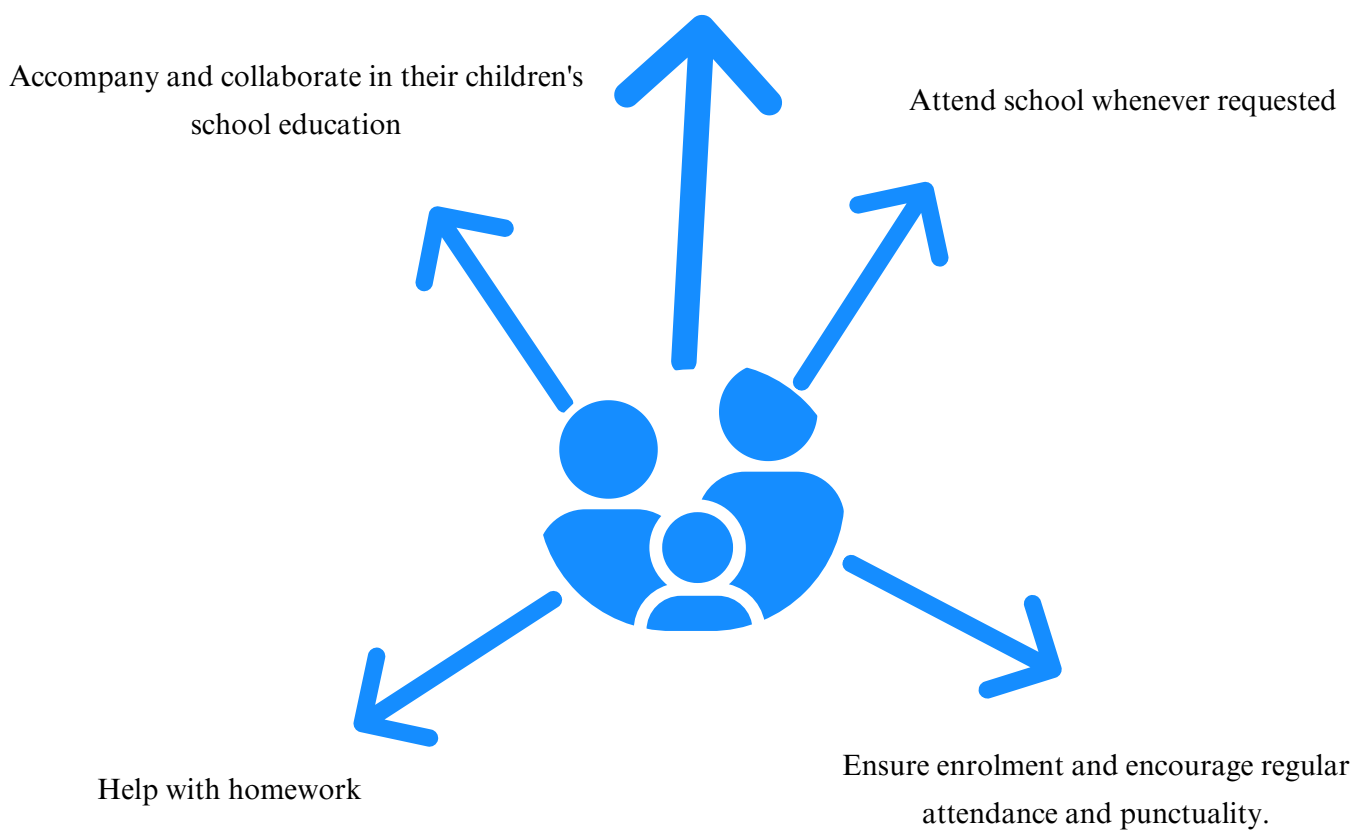
Basic education, divided into three cycles, aims to ensure a general education common to all students, providing the acquisition of basic knowledge that will enable them to continue their studies.

Secondary education offers a range of learning pathways and qualifications.

Higher education is the highest level of the education system and takes place in universities, colleges, polytechnics, colleges or other institutions that award academic degrees or professional diplomas.

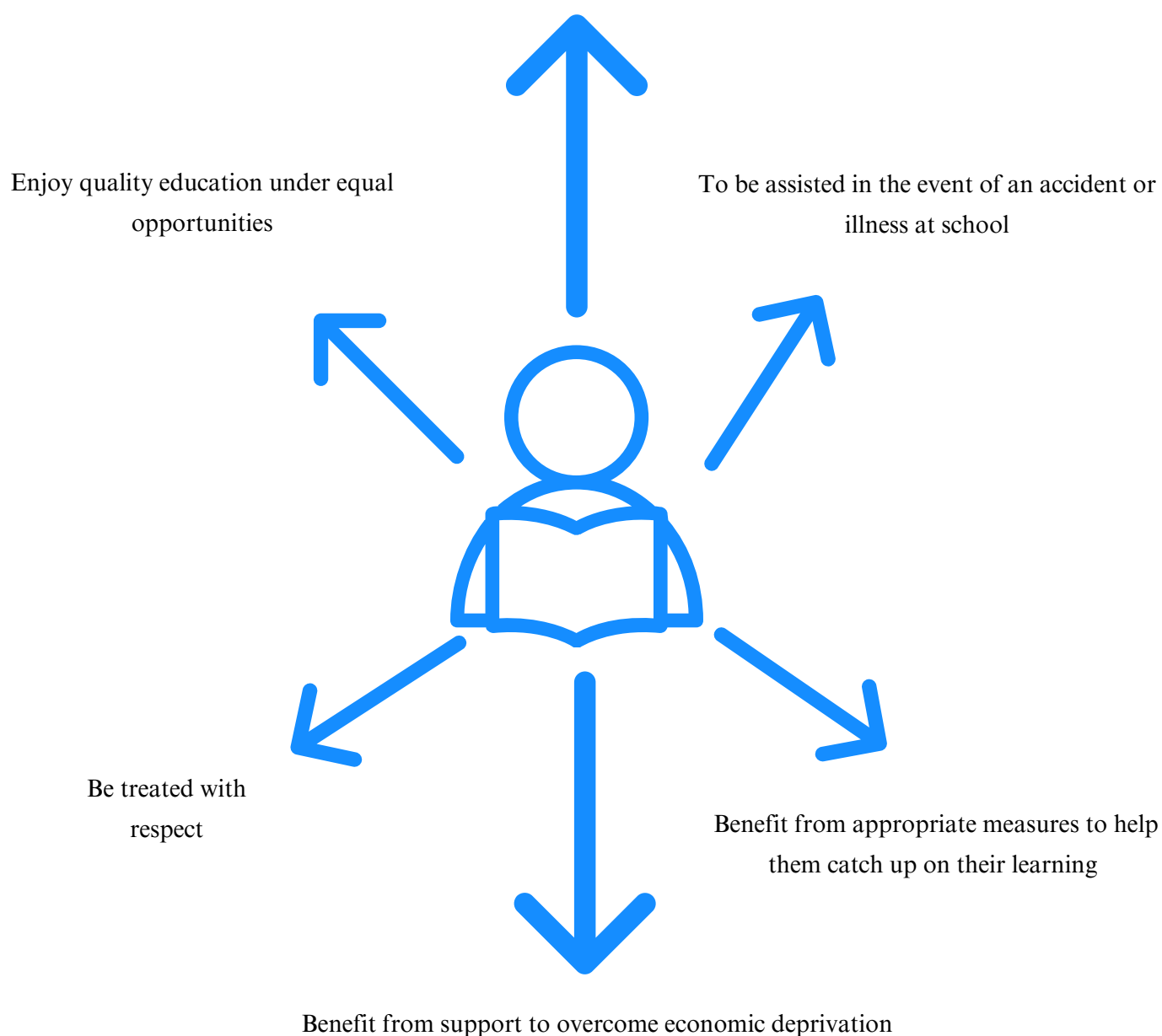

Be committed to schoolwork


